The Kentucky Retired Teachers Association welcomed close to 400 retired members and guests to the 2024 annual convention in April. The convention continued many of the same traditions as in the past but included a few new twists! The required meetings with District Presidents and the Executive Council were combined for the meeting and the luncheon. It proved to be a true time saver and the District Presidents felt that they were better informed by viewing (not voting) the Executive Council meeting. The Membership and Health & Insurance Workshops were informative and exciting!
